1. Pursuant to instructions contained in Paragraph 1 of Comment No. 1, the undersigned (Generals Isely and Kiesner) accompanied by Colonel J. G. Armstrong, the latter representing General Partridge, conferred with General Groves for more than an hour on the subject of training for bomb commanders and passengers.

2. General Groves indicated his full understanding of the AF position relative to passengers being air combat crew members as set forth in paragraph 3 of the draft memorandum to the Chief of Staff (Tab 2). He also agreed to the intake of adequate trainees to provide for a total of thirty (30) bomb commanders and forty-five (45) passengers.

3. The attached Memorandum for Record (Tab 1) sets forth the specific agreement reached at this conference. Since this matter has now been satisfactorily resolved at a level below the DC, AFM, and the War Department Chief of Staff, no further action is required by General Grants. In addition, no discussion on this subject with General Averell is believed necessary at this time.

4. It is recommended that:

- a. The Memorandum for General Sparks and enclosure (Tab 3) be forwarded; and
- b. The D/F and enclosure (Tab 4) be forwarded to the War Department (General Dorstad) in view of the fact that WPA/AF had been previously approached by the Air Staff and by General Groves in connection with the initiation of training of bomb commanders and passengers specifically for the AF.
